

Team Handicap Calculation – Individual handicaps are calculated using the slope and course rating of the tee box for everyone in the team. Without rounding, a percentage of that value (based on lowest to highest as shown below) is then taken and added to the rest of the team. The result is taken to two decimal places to aid any tie-breaks.

The percentage amount depends on how many players in the team. Player A being the lowest Handicap player, B being the next lowest, etc.

Two Ball/Player Texas Scramble: Player A 35% + Player B 15% = xx.xx HC

Minimum 6 drives each.

Any Team of 3 in a two ball competitions: Player A 15%, Play B, 10% and Player C 5%

Four Ball/Player Texas Scramble: Player A, 20%, Player B 15%, Player C 10%, Player D 5% = xx.xx% HC

Minimum 4 drives each drives each.

The team handicap will be shown on the draw sheet and score card.

Standard Golf and BSGS/local rules apply with the following **BSGS Scramble Rules:**

General Play:

- 1. Tee off from the Tee Box shown on THE DRAW and scorecard (White or Blue Men, Red Ladies).
- 2. Team chooses the best shot/ball position to play their next shot from until the hole is completed
- 3. Mark location of chosen ball and each team player places their ball within 15 cm of that spot, not closer to the hole
- 4. The lie must not be substantially improved, i.e. if in the rough, hazard or bunker, the ball must be played from inside that rough, hazard or bunker (Not moved outside).
- 5. Each player must contribute a minimum number drives as shown above. Please mark whose drive was taken on the card.
- 6. All cards must be legible, signed and handed into the Committee or caddie master or round is forfeited
- 7. Lift, Clean and place is allowed through the course

SCORECARDS

MARK ONLY YOUR GROSS TEAM SCORE AND WHO TEED OFF ON EACH HOLE (ONE NUMBER ONLY). Each team will receive a card with both names & Team handicap for the

day. There is no need for the team to calculate net scores. This will be done by the score spreadsheet.
